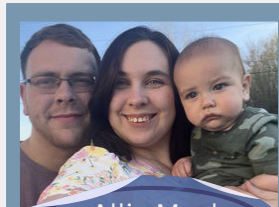
## The iHub

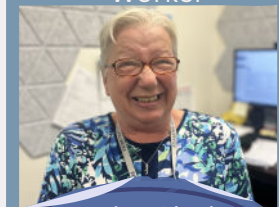
## InCA Staff Spotlights
